SECOR Certificates now paperless-effective February 28, 2022

Employers now have access to a PDF file of their SECOR!

No more waiting for the mail. Employers can access and print their own certificate through their myWCB account with the Workers' Compensation Board - Alberta. This is the same location where you can print your Partnerships in Injury Reduction reports. To download or print your SECOR certificate, just log into your myWCB account and click on Reports and Invoices. If you need assistance accessing your myWCB account, contact the eBusiness Support Team at 1-866-922-9221.

This new service significantly decreases red tape and increases efficiency by reducing turnaround time for a SECOR to reach its employer. As soon as your SECOR is approved, you can access it.



Is your training up to date?

Avoid letting your training and SECOR certificate lapse. Classes are scheduled monthly and have limited capacity.

Self-Evaluator Training must be renewed every three years. Audits will be rejected if conducted without valid training.

Critical Reminder!

Audit/Assessment Start Date:	Audit Assessment End Date:
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A red bracket is drawn below the table, spanning the width of both columns, indicating a 15-day period between the start and end dates.

This is your data gathering time.

It must not exceed the 15 days.

Audit must be received by AMTA no longer than **21 days** after Audit Assessment End Date.

Audits exceeding allowable timelines will be rejected
